

Yolngu Boy

Analyse the experiences of identity development in *Yolngu Boy*, comparing their experiences with your own.

This is to be written as an essay (approx 1000 words/3 pages) completed in one lesson without notes

In your essay ensure you include the following:

- The five fundamental course concepts (persons, societies, culture, environment and time)
- Socialisation
- Family and kinship
- Growing up/adolescence (including physical, cognitive, moral, emotional and social development)
- Coming of age (life-stages, rites of passage, changing rights and responsibilities, power and authority, gender, sexuality and ethnicity)
- Influences of both 'western' culture and Yolngu culture
